Discover Genoa

Genoa's beauty lies in its irregular shape and in the alleys of the medieval city swarming with life. The commercial port is the heart of the town and is one of the most important in the Mediterranean sea. Today, **Porto Antico**, the old port, is essentially a leisure and cultural area. Architect Renzo Piano is currently finishing the renovation of this area with his project to link Genoa to the sea again. **Genoa's Aquarium** is among the biggest in Europe. Its great tanks house sharks, dolphins and seals. Genoa's historic centre is the largest in Europe: a fascinating labyrinth of dark alleys ("caruggi") and small squares. Art is everywhere: on the frescoes of Baroque churches, on the sculpted slate doorways, in ancient shops.

The **Cathedral of San Lorenzo** impresses tourists with its elegance and its black and white facades. Visitors can also discover another aspect of Genoa's beauty in Quarto, Quinto, Nervi and Sant' Illariofishing villages to the east, situated between terraced hills and the sea, and with Mount Portofino in the background.

Thanks to a strong cultural history and the dynamism of its cultural life, Genoa has been selected to be the **European Capital of Culture** in 2004.

1. "Genoa 2004: European Capital of Culture", three hours walk, €10

A tour of the jewels of the Riviera di Levante with a guided visit in English and Italian. Stop in the magic village of Camogli with its colored houses facing the sea. Lunch in a restaurant. In the afternoon, visit of Santa Margherita Ligure with its hotels Liberty which evoke their famous guests. Participants will then embark on the boat for Portofino, the famous and exclusive resort located in a small bay below Mount Portofino and surrounded by a marvellous scenery. Journey back to Santa Margherita by boat where participants will have some free time before going back to Genoa by coach.
